ASSAULT 11/30/5 M Stairw-8 fl.	546 Main St.	RESISTING ARREST AND OTHER ACCESSORY CHARGES/ Officer was injured while in pursuit of perp. when officer tackled male perp. Pursuit initiated in 546 Main St.
BURGLARY 11/18/5 apt.	540 Main St.	Victim notified PSD that at 8:00 AM unk. person(s) rang doorbell 4 or 5 times; but no one was there upon answering door. Victim stated that when she returned at 5.00 PM, she noticed kitchen lights were on; but, did not notice anything missing. But at 9:00 PM, when her son brought a DVD, they noticed following items missing: Play Station 2, six games, six jersey sport shirts, for total of approx. US\$2,050. Victim said 3/4 sets of keys were missing since 11/17/5. Lt. referred incident to NYPD / responded, were not able to lift fingerprints. RIHM Super changed apt.'s lock.

11/25/5 hall, 7 fl.	540-546 Main	RIHM porter in-house, notified officer that unk. person had driven a hole into wall at scene. Officer searched "J" stairwell and immediate area, found no other damage. RIHM Super notified, photo taken.
11/26/5 apt.	560 Main St.	Female phoned PSD, said upon returning home she found unknown brown substance on her door. She complained that it is on-going instances of criminal mischief. Officers responded, substance appeared to be "chocolate frosting!"
11/28/5 4 fl. hall	540 Main St.	Officer on patrol saw broken plastic at scene (it was light fixture cover;) conducted search of 4 floor, discovered that at 546, 510 there were two light fixtures missing. RIHM service notified.
11/28/5 7 fl. halls	540-546 Main	While on patrol observed a small hole on wall on "S" stairwell. Subsequently RIHM handyman repaired same. Area was searched for further instances with negative results.

HARASSMENT 11/16/5 apt.	625 Main St.	AGGRAVATED Female in-house to file complaint against would be female sub-tenant, from whom she has received numerous phone calls threatening her with physical injury since June/05, because perp. left her property (including computer) at her apt. Victim could not contact her to inform her she would not be able to sub-let room to perp. and disposed of former's property (among them a computer which she donated.) Complainant was able to retrieve computer, mailed same to perp. in mid-November by UPS. NYPD responded, and will refer matter to detective unit at 114 th Pct.
11/17/5 youth ctr.	506 Main St.	Male (18 years of age) in-house, stated he was at Youth Center, when an underage male youth harassed him. NYPD notified/responded, prepared report. This is an on-going matter.
11/18/5 apt.	560 Main St.	Female phoned PSD, reported brother of ex-boyfriend visited her at apt., verbally threatened her, because she has order of protection against his brother. NYPD notified, female was not coherent and was asked to ask for aid when she is able to communicate.
11/24/5 apt.	546 Main St.	Elderly female in-house, stated neighbor has copy of her keys and had taken two certificates; was unable to describe what type of certificates. Female had difficulty in making herself understood.

Officer spoke with alleged perp., who stated that since last year, victim has been making false accusations against him. And that NYPD had investigated matter and had advised victim to stop making false

PHONE OUTAGE
