ARREST 12/3/5 apt.	510 Main St.	At approximately 9:10 AM, NYPD executed a search warrant at scene. Search yielded four loaded firearms, a quantity of cocaine, heroin and marijuana. Defendant also was found to be in possession of body vest armor and assorted ammunition. Defendant and female were removed from apt. in custody by NYPD.
ASSAULT 12/28/5 sidewalk	619 Main St.	ARREST BY NYPD Several teenagers approached Lt., advised that their friends were being assaulted at scene. Lt. radioed for additional officers. En-route they encountered victim #1 (bleeding from cuts on face and nose.) He was escorted to PSD, 911 was notified. Complainant said his friend who was also attacked, was still at location. Officers conducted search going south-bound. Victim #2 was located rear of 465 Main St. accompanied by two officers, former had swelling above left eye brow. Perp. #1 was seen by one of the officers with a jacket that had blood on it, and apprehended him. A wallet was found inside jacket with an ID of a male resident. Victim #2 and Perp. #1 were escorted to PSD. NYPD (114 th Pct.) responded. Search of perp. #2 did not have ID.

Victim refused medical assistance. Perp. had fled southbound toward subway after taking US\$2.00, cellular phone, I-pod, debit card & other misc. items from victim's bag. NYPD conducted a "show-up" with possible perp. with negative results.
TRESPASS 12/6/5 f/o apt.	556 Main St.	ARREST Anonymous female in-house, said she saw male sleeping in front of main floor apt. Officers responded, saw the man, escorted him to PSD, issued him a "C" summons. He was given phone number of Coalition for the Homeless and addresses.
CRIMINAL MISCHIEF 12/5/5 psd	552 Main St.	Patrolling officer saw that back window at PSD was shattered. RIOC maintenance crew will apply duct tape, until repairs can be made.
12/6/5 exterior window	591 Main	Officer responded to RIOC office for report of three "BB" gun holes in southern exposure window of office. All holes appeared to have been "BB" gun projectiles and were shot from an unknown location.
12/13/5 4 fl. hall	540 Main St.	Officers responded to scene for possible broken window adjacent to elevator; D.O. & RIHM notified, latter responded applied duct tape to window & a piece of wood. Officers searched area for further incidents with negative results.
12/18/5 children's play grd.	500 Main	Officer responded to scene for report of the plexi-glass at scene having been broken. Same has very sharp edges. Porter did not have proper equipment to remove same. Pictures were taken. Subsequently, porter in-house, stated that remaining plexi-glass was removed. Graffiti had been written on plexi-glass.

12/5/5 apt. 580 Main St. / AGGRAVATED Officers responded to scene; victim complained she was receiving phone calls from non-resident female (who was in bldg. vestibule, trying to gain entry.) Officers asked for perp's. ID, which she could not supply and was asked to leave premises. Victim said perp. continually threatens her & challenges her to go outside to fight. NYPD responded (wrote Agg. Harass. Report,) asked officers to remain with victim, while he conducted search, PSD officers searched as well with negative results. Perp. could not be located.

12/6/5 apt. 580 Main St. / AGGRAVATED Female phoned PSD, complained that non-resident female continues to threaten her over the phone. This is an on-going situation. NYPD contacted/responded, wrote another Agg. Harass. Report.)

Afterwards victim realized his cellular phone was missing. Youth's mother contacted, responded to PSD. The other youths' (3) parents notified, responded. 12/19/5 subway sta. 400 Main St. OFF ISLAND Male in-house showed a Bank of America fraud control letter to D.O., stating that his Visa card with R.I. address was used to buy two Metro Cards. D.O. notified 911 to respond to male's address. NYPD responded to victim's apt., victim was not at home to file complaint.

12/2/5 street 619 Main St. Male in-house, stated he parked Verizon truck at scene and entered restaurant to order food; and that he left a 4 GB I-Pod Mini inside truck. However, he left door unlocked. While waiting for the food, victim stated he saw male lingering around truck. Complainant exited restaurant in front of China I, returned to get his food. CAR STOP/LEAVING SCENE

12/31/5 street 549 Main St. Officers completed search for hit & run vehicle, parked patrol car behind a sedan. When officer was exiting patrol car, officer flagged down motorist to discontinue a U-turn, however, motorist failed to comply. Other officer at car-stop, advised male motorist of violation; latter proceeded to use foul language at officer and sped off. He had, however, given relevant information to another officer. Lt. to contact Captain to obtain further information to issue summons. Officer got in touch with 114th Pct., but system was down. There were no injuries.

HAZARDOUS CONDITION

12/6/5 road, f/o M/G 686 Main St. Sgt. observed hole in the road and placed a cone over same. RIOC Maintenance Supervisor advised, and condition corrected.

12/23/5 3-A rear, 7-D 688 Main St. While on patrol Sgt. observed entire 7-D front part and rear part of 3-A's lights not working. M/G foreman was notified. Sgt. had officer monitor area.

Victim called NYPD, who explained that at this time she has no proof of who called ACS, and nothing can be done.
12/16/5	apt.	510 Main St.	Lt. and two officers responded to above apt. with ACS case workers, who said male had seized his daughter (8 years old) and attempted to choke her. Girl's mother went to 114 th Pct. NYPD, made a walk-in complaint. officer saw copy of domestic incident report. NYPD responded, prepared report, ACS will conduct investigation.
12/17/5	apt.	510 Main St.	Male in-house, said another male was harassing him. Officers responded to apt. It seems perp said he rents room from victim, and that perp. had gone to his room to sleep with his wallet in his pocket. Wallet had contained US\$200, upon awaking his wallet was gone.
