<b>ARREST WARRANT SERVED BY OTHER AGENCY</b>		
1/22/6 apt.	540 Main St.	NYPD Detective in-house, PSD officers accompanied him to perp's. mother's apt. where male was taken into custody.
<b>ARREST RECKLESS DRIVING, RECKLESS ENDANGERMENT, ETC.</b>		
1/27/8	591 Main St.	Reporting officer observed male resident park his auto on 540 breezeway, and approached car notifying him he could not park there, and reiterated the request. Perp. stated he would comply, but in fact did not. Officer blew horn, perp. moved car to original parking place. Ultimately perp. drove off at high rate of speed; officers were in pursuit. Finally perp's. car struck patrol car #1 in front bumper. Perp. was given "C" summons.
