

**The Main Street WIRE and Website NYC10044 present this Public Safety Blotter as received from the Roosevelt Island Operating Corporation and, with the exception of expanding some obscure Public Safety Department or Roosevelt Island abbreviations and obvious typographical errors, make no changes.**

## **Public Safety Department Incident Report Summary**

**April 2006**

### **Assault**

4/13/6, street, rear of 475 Main St. NYPD detective reported numerous complaints of gun shots at scene. NYPD responded to anonymous female who stated she had witnessed same. That several youths had been arguing and a tall heavy-set youth fired shots and fled North-East. NYPD searched area with negative results and reported 540 rear door was open. Several casings were found. Sgt. spoke with 475 concierge, cameras were checked, but did not show location at 3:09 AM. Update by deputy: 4/14/06 – 10:30 AM – NYPD detective confirmed there was a male victim with gun shot wound at Elmhurst and he was identified as a young non-resident, shot in his buttocks on Roosevelt Island. No Arrest was made, but PSD and NYPD do have leads as to who is the perp.

4/30/6, front of pizzeria, 536 Main St., Arrest. Roosevelt Island's Search & Rescue Chief phoned PSD, reported dispute at scene. Officers responded, but no one was at scene. However, officers noticed a section of the storefront glass was shattered. Reporter pointed out victim who was near-by. Officer and Sgt. escorted the male to PSD, who denied having been involved in the incident; but consequently did admit he was pushed into window in dispute over money. He ultimately gave perp's name, address to officers. Officers went to address supplied, ultimately Arrested him. Officers escorted him to PSD. NYPD/EMS requested/ responded. EMS transported victim. Perp. was transported to 114<sup>th</sup> Pct. for processing. RIHM Super stated that damage to window would be US\$1,750. Cones were set up in front of 536 Main St. Perp's mother stated she wanted a cross-complaint written on son's behalf and she was given son's possessions.

### **Robbery**

4/21/6, apt., 546 Main St. Female phoned PSD, reported robbery that occurred that time in the morning. Officers responded, victim stated she was expecting visitor, opened door, male perp. #1 pushed her into apt., covered her mouth and threatened to shoot her if she continued to scream; asked where the money was, went into kitchen upon being advised, took US\$20.00 from the counter and fled with his accomplice, perp. #2. Victim was not injured, refused EMS, 911

notified for NYPD Lt. and an officer responded, prepared report, case referred to Detectives. A complete search of building was made, as well as the entire Island with negative results. Detective arrived at scene, interviewed victim and conducted another search with negative results.

4/27/6, front of apt., 540 Main St. Male non-resident in-house, screaming that he was just robbed at gun-point by unknown male as he was entering his uncle's apt. Perp. brandished a 9MM automatic, pushed him into uncle's apt., demanded money. Victim said he had just cashed income tax check of approximately US\$1,000, which he had hidden in his shoes. Complainant also said perp. ripped phone from wall, and took two cellular phones, so the latter could not make any calls. Perp. also asked victim for gold medallion that he had seen him wear before. Victim also said at first he refused, and he was struck twice on head with gun. Officer saw two bumps on his head, but refused EMS. Perp. ran out of apt. to street and towards subway. Victim came to PSD to report occurrence. NYPD was notified/responded and prepared report. The victim's uncle in-house and stated he had been in his apt. when robbery was in progress.

### **Criminal Mischief**

4/1/6, T, roof, 580 Main St. Officer responded to scene for alarm, conducted search for perp(s), with negative results, further observed that roof alarm had been tampered with Alarms wires had been disconnected/forcefully separated. RIHM was notified, responded and will try to fix the condition.

4/1/6, park, north of 900 Main St., While officer was on patrol in area, officer discovered that flood light had been broken and searched area for possible perp(s) with negative results.

4/4/6, I-1-10 floor, 540 Main St., RIHM Super notified PSD of graffiti at scene. Officer searched Stairwell H for perpetrator(s), and all was in order.

4/6/6, hall, 7 floor, 540/546 Main St. While on patrol, officer observed two large holes that had been kicked in a wall. RIHM was notified.

4/17/6, rear lobby, 540 Main St., RIHM Super in-house, unknown person removed safety panel from inside elevator. Elevator could not close, and was put out of service. Officer informed Super about holes in 7<sup>th</sup> floor as well as the damaged window panel. Photo was taken. Subsequently other Super in-house, stated elevator camera was checked for perp(s), but it had gone out of service.

Door to storage room bent, door frame damaged, the heater board had been taken off the wall. Officer could not secure door because the lock was damaged. RIHM maintenance notified.

4/28/6, hall, front of #536, 546 Main St., Officer responded to scene for possible broken glass; upon arrival he saw broken bottle, corrected condition. RIHM will be notified. Officer conducted a vertical patrol of 546, no other incidents to report.

4/30/6, garden patio, 540 Main St., Female resident in-house, reported unknown person had thrown debris at scene. Upon officer's arrival, he saw a broken sign from Blackwell playground. Reporter refused NYPD. UPDATE: While officer was searching the park officer saw multiple trash cans in Blackwell/North Town Park turned over, some were cracked. RIOC Facilities Form filled out. Officers searched the parks, West/East sea walls for perps. with negative results.

4/4/6, roof, 9 floor, 580 Main St., Officers responded to roof alarm, upon arrival they encountered three under age male youths, and escorted them to PSD to await family members to pick them up. Mother, cousin and aunt subsequently picked them up. Youths stated they had no

mischief in mind, they were just curious. RIHM Super was notified that roof door's lock was not working. Door was fixed later.

4/11/6, Motorgate 1-A, 688 Main St., Anonymous female informed officer on patrol that she had seen two underage males riding their bicycles on level 1-A. Other officers responded, picked up the two youths. Parents were notified and they were released in their recognizance.

4/30/6, 10 fl., rear, 540 Main St., RIHM employee radioed that unknown perp(s) caused the electric pipe to hang loose from ceiling. Super arrived, conducted a test on fire alarm system, and it functioned, but lights were missing. Officer searched Stairs "T" from 10 to lobby, no other damage was seen. 4/25/6, st., front of Post Office, 694 Main St., Arrest Officer on patrol, observed male non-resident place a malt liquor bottle on top of a Lexus car; requested another officer at scene; and approached perp, and requested ID. Three officers responded. Perp. was informed he would be issued a "C" summons. Perp. said he needed to move car or he would receive a summons. Sgt. informed him he could not drive, that another person would have to move his vehicle. Perp. was escorted to PSD. Perp's brother responded to PSD with valid NYD license, and car's documents in order.

stopped in the middle. Tram Financial Chief was on scene and notified them there was a power shortage and that tram's Head Engineer and maintenance personnel were working on the problem. The former stated the situation had arisen because of an electrical shortage on the hydraulic system, consequently the cabins would not be able to be lowered. NYPD officers, ESU and EMS were also at scene. PSD Director, Deputy were notified. RIOC present at scene as well as Capt. Suarez. SOD and OEM Inspector requested a Command Center be set up. NYPD Planning Chief coordinated an evacuation. At 10:22 PM, ESU and Tram engineers began evacuation process. Mayor Bloomberg and NYPD Commissioner Kelly were at scene. NYPD Lt. Cook stated Con Edison will assist in evacuation process by supplying a large tractor, etc. Director Fry sent a bus to Manhattan. Deputy Bryan, Sgt. Jones were on Manhattan side. At 4:13 AM the Sgt. reported that all victims had been taken off the Tram and there were no injuries incurred. Tram engineers will remain at scene to lower cars into station.

4/18/6, apt., 560 Main St., Female phoned PSD, stated her sister and she were engaged in a physical dispute, the latter had struck her on the face, body with an iron. Officers responded as well as NYPD who prepared report. Woman refused EMS. No injuries were observed. Sisters were referred to Family Court.
