<b>ASSAULT</b>		
8/1/6 street	579 Main St.	While patrolling officer saw male youth yelling that his father who was also at scene and holding a stick bat in his hand, was hitting him and his mother with it; a daughter and another son had then hit the father. NYPD, EMS responded, transported youth to Cornell Hospital. The father fled to his apt., NYPD responded there, but he refused to open the door. NYPD will prepare a report and refer the matter to detective squad.
8/12/6 apt.	4 River Rd.	<b>ARREST BY NYPD</b> Officer heard call over NYPD Scanner requesting assistance at scene. Officers responded, upon arrival numerous NYPD officers at location, who informed officers that female resident was intoxicated, violent and had stabbed her boyfriend in the arm. NYPD were handling the situation and transporting female to Elmhurst Hospital.

8/1/6 apt. door	560 Main St.	Female notified PSD that unk. person(s) had covered most of her apt. door with an “unidentifiable” substance. This is on-going. RIHM super cleaned it. NYPD was refused.
8/5/6 mail boxes	546 Main St.	Officer responded to lobby for report of vandalized mail boxes, was met by RIHM super, they confirmed there was a broken into mailbox, officer and super looked at mail to verify ownership of same.

Male was yelling from the vehicle, attempting to exit, female kept exiting vehicle, both were using abusive language at Sgt. from the car. Ultimately male, female were issued "C" summonses.

#### HARASSMENT

8/4/6	g's	686 Main St.	Gristede's Mgr. notified PSD that intoxicated, anonymous male entered the market, approached him in a surly manner, threatened him face-to-face that he would sue the store and exited. Victim also said that perp. had checked the aisles looking for him, did not find him and left. Victim refused NYPD, but requested a PSD IR be written.
8/6/6	apt.	556 Main St.	Female in-house said that about 12 noon male perp. was banging on her apt. door, her brother answered, a dispute ensued, perp. slapped female on her face. Victim stated she called NYPD, they responded, prepared report. At 6:00 PM, female again in-house, following victim as she tried to leave area. Victim was escorted to her apt. by officer. 8/1/6 r/o V stairw. exit 580 Main Apparently truck backed up into bushes and pipe (photo taken.) RIHM super estimated damage to the area to be approx. US\$300.00.

8/1/6	apt.	580 Main St.	Female alleges male entered her apt. (door was ajar) and took her purse, she struggled with him, perp. who was her ex-boyfriend and fled. PSD officers apprehended male at which time female changed her story, saying perp. had been wearing a hood & could not ID him. NYPD responded and did not prepare a report.
8/5/6	street, adj.	10 River Rd.	Officers responded to scene for report of misc. men's clothing being thrown out of window; they searched floors 4 <sup>th</sup> to 20 <sup>th</sup> with negative results. Concierge notified them female resident brought suitcase to his station, said a male (also a resident) would be picking it up. Apt. was checked periodically with negative results. UPDATE: 8/6/6, 12:23 AM, concierge phoned, said female could not retrieve suitcase.
8/7/6	3 fl. laundry	540 Main St.	Youth and sister were at scene. Another youth began calling male youth names, victim replied, youth then challenged him to fight. Youth hugged the sister and slapped youth in the head. Victim responded to PSD, officer went to laundry room, advised youth that his mother would be notified. Officer left message for victim's father, so both parents can meet.
8/7/6	apt.	560 Main St.	Female in-house reported having seen/smelled a "sweet-smelling" substance on her door; she called service who responded, cleaned door. It is an on-going situation.

She thought it was unusual, since every establishment was closed. Officers responded to scene, searched halls with negative results; informed complainant to call PSD again if it re-occurs.
