BLOTTER: JAN. 1 TO 15, 2007

ASSAULT

1/9/7 red bus #3 888 Main St. Officers responded to scene; upon arrival Garage Supervisor was at scene. Alleged perp. was escorted to PSD; bus driver followed. Female witness told an officer she was at bus stop, and saw two males engaged in a physical dispute, and that the alleged perp. was intoxicated. Operator of bus #1, contacted Bus Supervisor, who responded. Victim refused EMS and to press charges. NYPD Sgt. responded.

ROBBERY

1/2/7 m/g 688 Main St. Officers responded to scene, where male Goldwater patient and two friends, all wheel chair-bound were robbed via the "strong-arm" method by three unknown males of US\$120.00, one T-Mobile cell phone and one light blue school bag containing four cartons of cigarettes. Two perps. fled east-bound and one west-bound. Victim #1 described the perps. On island NYPD responded, prepared report and joined search for perps. with negative results.

CRIMINAL MISCHIEF

1/1/7 apts. 546 Main St. Officer saw two six-inch holes in hall in front of two fourth-floor apts. Officer also observed graffiti in area.

1/1/7 apt. 575 Main St. Lt. responded to scene for burnt door handle. Complainant said handle had been in good order on 12/31/6. Upon returning at 8:50 PM it was burned. Knob works. A search of 12th floor was conducted, there were no other instances of criminal mischief.

1/5/7 7-C 688 Main St. Officer saw vehicle with broken driver's side window, shattered window glass and a cologne bottle at scene; Motorgate attendant notified, who notified owner's mother, since he is out of the country.

1/9/7 7-C 688 Main St. Officer responded to scene, where male stated unk. person had broken his vehicle's rear windshield. Officer went to where Buick was parked, confirmed it. Officer searched area from 7th to 2nd floors with negative results.

1/12/7 senior center 546 Main St. Officer saw two holes that perhaps had been made by small pellet bee-bee gun, but no other visible damage. RIHM was notified, Super Morgan responded. Officer searched area for other instances with negative results.

1/15/7 m/g, 6-D 688 Main St. / LARCENY Male phoned PSD, reported that unknown person had broken into his car, broken rear vent window; removed computer. Trunk was also damaged. Victim will report incident to NYPD.

1/15/7 apt. 560 Main St. Officer arrived at scene, heard loud noises, observed fire works being discharged; notified RIHM service for debris removal. Subsequently officer responded to 3rd floor for smoke condition, again saw debris from fireworks. RIHM Super Benoit was at scene. No damage observed.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

1/7/7 street 645 Main St. ARREST Officer observed two female youths engaged in verbal dispute. As officer approached them, one female struck the other's face; he called for assistance, other officers responded. Perp. was issued a "C" summons. Underage female was issued Juvenile Report by NYPD; mother responded to PSD. The oldest child, approximately eight years old, is listed in I.R. as sole victim; other children's names unavailable.

HARASSMENT

1/11/7 hall 540 Main St. Female in-house, reported that five underage youths were knocking on her door and running away. Complainant is annoyed. The next tour will be advised of incident.

1/13/7 apt. 580 Main St. AGGRAVATED Officer responded to scene, female said she was being harassed via telephone by male witness's wife. And it must have occurred approximately 50 times. NYPD, PSD responded. NYPD prepared report.

ACS CHILD REMOVAL

1/10/7 apt. 510 Main St. Officer observed NYPD at scene, NYPD officer reports ACS requested assistance for removal of four children at scene.

ALARM

1/3/7 apt. 531 Main St. Concierge reported alarm company reported motion detector sounding in apt. Officer responded to exterior patio, noted all windows appeared secure. Sgt. responded to 2nd floor, doors were secured. Concierge stated there had been no unknown persons who had entered the building. Search of area was conducted with negative results.

1/8/7 adj. tram 300 Main St. Officer heard alarm emanating from white trailer at scene and performed perimeter search for any break-ins with negative results. Lt. responded, D.O. notified for log entry.

1/15/7 child school 587 Main St. Officers responded to scene, alarm was sounding, they searched perimeter of school, checked doors/windows, etc. All were secure. Officer left message for Principal.

ABANDONED CAT

1/7/7 1 floor, rear 580 Main St. Officers responded to scene, saw what appeared to be an abandoned cat, as well as a litter box, food, water. Officers rang all bells on the floor, no owner was found. Sgt. made several phone calls with negative results. Cat remains at its original place.

CHILD ABUSE

1/5/7 apt. 30 River Rd. Officers responded to scene for female youth having difficulty breathing. Apparently parent beat youth with belt. EMS, NYPD responded. EMT noted multiple belt "markings" on child's body. NYPD notified Dept. of State at U.N. Parent escorted with child to NYU Hospital. Report prepared by NYPD.

DEFECTIVE METROCARD

1/11/7 plaza 300 Main St. Officers responded to scene. Upon arrival an underage male youth was identified by tram operator. The youth was escorted by gym teacher, who explained the card was defective, and were informed by tram operator they would have to buy another card to board the tram. Condition was ultimately corrected.

DISPUTE

1/3/7 front of 2/4 River Rd. Officer arrived at scene, saw two males engaged in a dispute. Also at scene was a female. Upon officer's arrival, one of the males (the father of the female's baby) entered a car and drove off-island. Officer requested assistance and PSD officers complied. The victim and remaining male said the baby's father had attacked her and the remaining male. Both male and female refused NYPD report.

1/9/7 street 504 Main St. ARREST Officers responded to assist another officer for a fight in progress (between female and male youth.) And approximately 10 youths observing the fight, female walked away and had bruises on her face. Several youths got involved in the fight. Parents and guardians of the youths were called to PSD for resolution. Victim's mother requested that charges be filed against male youth after speaking with NYPD officer, who placed male under arrest. EMS responded, transported victim to Elmhurst. Director, Capt. and Lt. were notified.

1/13/7 apt. 540 Main St. DOMESTIC Female resident reported a fight at scene, officers responded, encountered male and son engaged in verbal dispute. Son, who refused to ID himself, left area. NYPD refused.

1/15/7 apt. 546 Main St. Officer responded to scene for possible dispute. Female stated she wanted her home attendant to leave premises. She was unsatisfied with her; home attendant complied.
